The purpose of conducting these activities is not only to blend learning with fun but also to develop confidence and a sense of camaraderie among students despite being physically distance.


Theatre in Formative years help students to be involved in every way, be it intellectually,

Keeping this in mind, SXHS have organised Xavarian Theatre Fest 2021 from Monday, 22nd Nov. to Thursday, 25th Nov.


Around 600 students of grade Pre Nursery to grade II along with the teachers have worked very hard for this virtual production.

#### XAVERIAN PODTALE










### **Celebrating the Fervour of Christmas**Day 2 - Vocal Ecstasy, An Evening of Carol Singing
